Now, more than ever, the need for a healthy community is the difference between merely surviving this pandemic and thriving in our "next normal". Building healthy communities has been the foundation of what we do at the Y, and we feel poised and prepared to continue playing a critical role in helping the people in our community thrive.

In this year's Annual Report, we are proud to share that our impact is as strong as ever. We welcomed more than 90,000 people to our Y in 2019, nearly an 8% increase over 2018. This large number represents individual members of our community who came together in search of a healthier lifestyle, others who

were seeking friendship and a sense of belonging, and those wanting to grow and learn to build brighter future options. And with more than \$837,000 given by the Y in financial aid last year, our doors remained open and truly accessible to everyone in our community.
