Message to the Community

If the last few years have taught us anything, it is that change will always be present in our lives, and that to grow and thrive, we must fully embrace it and adapt. Adapting to change and welcoming growth is something I can relate to well, having recently joined the Y team as the new President and CEO at the YMCA of the National Capital Region. It has been an incredible time of learning and planning – both for me, and for our newly appointed Board Chair, Anne. Together, we are excited to continue the great work that was already underway, while looking ahead at new ways to respond to shifting environments and urgent needs identified by our community.

In 2023, our Y worked towards stability and recovery, laying the foundation for a brighter future. With support from the Board of Directors, we invested in our most valuable asset – our staff team – launching an ambitious compensation philosophy and strategy. We also saw an increased number of people access our Health, Fitness, and Aquatics programs, hosted the Y Embassy Chef Showcase – a unique new fundraising event – and expanded our transitional housing spaces with a new 20-bed program for adult women.

Overall, we welcomed more than 42,000 people in Y programs and services last year and granted nearly \$207,000 in financial assistance to those who would otherwise not have been able to participate – a 72% increase of assistance provided over last year. Also increased was our engagement with newcomers to Canada. We saw a 39% increase in immigrants requiring support accessing essential services in 2023, something we expect to be an ongoing need as demographics in our region change.

It has never been more critical to have a healthy, thriving Y in our community. We are well underway developing our strategic plan for the next 5 years -a plan that our staff, donors, partners, and community members have been engaged with – coming together to help us shine brighter and grow stronger on our new path forward.

In fact, as we have our eyes firmly fixed on the rest of 2024 and beyond, we know how vital it is to proactively plan for our Y's evolution and to support emerging needs in the National Capital Region. With the help of our community partners and dedicated staff and volunteer teams, we will be bolstering our newcomer and employment services, addressing the growing demands for child care services, re-envisioning community support through health, fitness, and aquatics, and responding to the homelessness crisis in our region. A lot of positive changes are on the way!

Thank you for being a part of our Y family. With support from you and our community, the YMCA of the National Capital Region will continue to be a beacon of hope, where we provide the guidance, encouragement, and inspiration to help everyone reach their potential.

Shining a Light on Community Impact: Beatrice & Brian

It was a long journey for Beatrice to arrive in Canada. In 2013, she was displaced from her home country of Rwanda. Over the next ten years, she would move to Ethiopia, then Kenya, and in the midst of it all, she gave birth to her son, Brian.

In February of 2023, Beatrice and her then 6-year-old son finally moved to Canada. She chose to settle in Ottawa because she knew a friend who lived here. Her friend offered them a room to stay temporarily, but with limited space for two families, it wasn't a long-term solution.

After a few weeks in Canada, Beatrice reached out to social services. They guided her to connect with the Y Transitional Family Housing program at the Shenkman Residence.

Beatrice didn't know what to expect after years of fending for herself. She was surprised by the warmth and support she felt from Y staff from the moment they arrived with transportation. "It gave me peace. It gave me hope that there are people with heart." Once she was settled, Beatrice began meeting with Irene, an Employment Consultant at the Y Employment Access Centre. Irene assisted her in getting connected to the Y's hospitality and tourism skills training program. She also showed Beatrice how to write and format a resume and helped her land her current job.

As Y residents, Beatrice and Brian were welcome to use the fitness facilities. Brian enjoyed playing in the Kids Zone, and with access to the pool and swimming lessons, they both learned how to swim!

In March of 2024, Beatrice and Brian moved into an apartment of their own through a subsidized housing program. Beatrice is happy to have this new, bigger space with a playground nearby. Despite having his own bedroom now, Brian still asks to visit the Y to say hello to the staff.

Through all of her experiences at the Y, Beatrice feels that she has become a new person. "Now I am okay, and I have self-confidence. I feel I have a right to speak. I feel I have a right to express."

199 children and youth **called the Y home**– finding stability, and the chance to just be a kid.



The **Y Employment Access Centre** provided local businesses with access to **\$662K** in financial incentives, helping them fund employee on-boarding and/or training.



244 Employment workshops and **1,026 Newcomer workshops** were delivered to people ready to make important changes in their lives, setting the stage for long term success.

Shining a Light on Community Impact: Kelly & Wilder

Every time Kelly drove by Camp Otonabee on her way to work, it stood out to her as a classic summer camp. She always wanted to be able to give her 6-year-old son, Wilder, the experience of going to a camp like that, but as a single mom supporting two children with disabilities, it seemed out of the question.

In 2023, her hopes were made possible when she was offered financial support through the Evelyne E. Laishley Campership Fund. Receiving this annual sponsorship fund meant that Wilder had the opportunity to attend a day program at Camp Otonabee. "To let him have that typical summer experience, that he can go back to school with and relate to others ... I just think it's so important," Kelly shared.

Wilder is an active kid. He loves building with LEGO and being outside. He also has a limb difference and wears a prosthetic. For Kelly, having a son with a disability means that acceptance and accommodation are necessary in new environments. "It is a large requirement when Wilder will be attending somewhere that I'm not going to be present." Camp Director, Marisa, alongside Assistant Director, Hannah, met with Kelly and Wilder in advance to discuss how to best support him at camp. They talked about when he should be wearing his prosthetic, appropriate language to use, and how potential comments from other children would be handled.

Kelly believed that Camp Otonabee would be a great fit for Wilder, and she was proven right. Wilder made friends and participated in activities like canoeing, swimming and nature walks. He was particularly proud of facing his fears on the high rope course. "The first time I did it, I was scared," said Wilder. "The second time, I wanted to go to the top ... It was fun!"

Kelly saw that Wilder was excited to wake up every morning and return to camp for more adventures. "I could see his confidence was growing in himself and in his social relationships."

Wilder will have the opportunity to come back to Camp Otonabee for a second year. He and Kelly are both looking forward to it. "We're so grateful for the support for Wilder. It doesn't just make a difference in his life, it also makes a different in mine."
